The Penge Heritage Trail leaflet and website was launched in May 2018 through public subscription via the *Spacehive* crowdfunding platform for local projects. The project manager was Dr Chris O'Shaughnessy. Chris worked closely with Bromley Council to secure funding for the twelve heritage pavement plaques which are a significant part of the Trail around Penge. There is also a blue Penge Heritage Trail plaque on the former old police station.

Most of the information about the Trail is on the website itself. The website has been high commended by Kellogg College, Oxford University. The leaflet guide and map of the Trail can be downloaded and printed from the website. Hard copies can be picked up from various outlets in Penge: the Library, Solitaire, Designer Drapes, Property World. Alternatively the map can be accessed on a smartphone.
